Shape

Air helps a plane to fly. A plane must be the right shape for the air to move around it. The plane's body, wings, and tail help the air to move around the plane in the right way.



Engine

The plane's engine gives it the power to take off and fly. The engine burns fuel. This makes heat. The heat pushes gases out of the back of the plane, which makes the plane move forward.

Artists make drawings by using a pencil or charcoal to draw a picture on a piece of paper or another smooth surface.

Artists make **paintings** by using a paintbrush to paint on a piece of paper, canvas, or other material.

Photographers make photographs with cameras. Photographers like to use light and shadow to make their photographs more interesting.

Artists make collages by gluing or taping different materials onto a surface to make a picture or pattern. You can use lots of interesting material to make a collage, such as plastic, fabric, metal, or shells.

Sculptors make sculptures by carving wood or stone, or by shaping clay. Some sculptors also make sculptures by joining metal, wire, or other materials together to make a shape or figure.
